


Environmental Commitment Statement



Subject: Integrated Pest Management Plan (IPMP) Implementation Authority

Title: Integrated Pest Management Plan, 130th Airlift Wing, Yeager Airport, Charleston, West Virginia.

Purpose: To implement an Integrated Pest Management Plan for 130th Airlift Wing, Yeager Airport, Charleston, West Virginia.

Regulatory References:

- U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) Directive 4150.07, Pest Management Program dated 29 May 2008 and DoD Directive 4715.1, "Environmental Security," Chapter 4, dated 19 March 2005.
- U.S. Air Force Pest Management Program, Air Force Instruction (AFI) 32-1053, dated 23 June 2011
- 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 158, Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFR)
- A). Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), 7 U.S.C. 136, et seq.

Summary: The IPMP has been prepared in accordance with DoD Instruction 4150.07. The subject IPMP is a comprehensive document that will be used by all personnel working at the 130th Airlift Wing (130 AW). It has been designed to ensure installation compliance with federal, state, and US Territory regulations governing pest management.

Enforceability: Integrated Pest Management Plans are enforceable under both the Clean Water Act and Sikes Act. In addition, recordkeeping is also enforceable under the Clean Water Act (CWA). Thus, lack of compliance with this plan by the installation could result in non-compliance with CWA, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), and Sikes Act.

Security Classification: The title and document are unclassified. The document does not fall within the scope of directives governing the protection of information affecting national security. This IPMP will be designated "For Official Use Only."

Applicability: In accordance with DoD Instruction 4150.07, all ANG installations are required to prepare and maintain a pest management plan. All applicable personnel will review the IPMP and ensure full compliance. Through implementation and cooperation, a safe, healthy, and clean environment for current and future generations can be ensured. No in-house or contract pest control operations, including pesticide (ex. herbicide, insecticide, rodenticide, etc.) applications, may be conducted on base without prior coordination and approval from installation designated IPMP Coordinator.

Action: The IPMP is effective as of 12 October 2011, the date of approval by the 130 AW Environmental, Safety and Occupational Health Council (ESOHC), chaired by the Installation Commander.
